Who is the most "Founding" of our Founding Fathers?

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Essential Questions

Who are our Founding Fathers? How did their ideas, writings, actions shape our country during their lives? What effects do they have on our country today?

Historical Background

America's history has many fascinating characters. Some of the most fascinating come from our founding generation. These individuals fought a war for independence and founded a new government for a new nation and shaped it in its early years. To understand the Revolutionary period, one can look at the cast of characters that played the biggest roles. The intent of this Instructional Plan is for 8th grade students study the lives and contributions of our founders using biography and primary resources. The 8th graders will then do what they do best, argue. They will debate these individuals answering the questions of "Who is the most significant?" Based on these debates, evaluated by the students in class, we will obtain a top fifteen poll of "Who is the Most Founding of our Founding Fathers."

Guided Discovery Activity/Student Learning Activity

This activity is for the 8th grade level.

The Project:

- 1. Have students choose a founder from the following list or one that is not on the list if he/she can make a case that the individual should be included on the list.
- 2. Two students will research each founder. One student(referred to as Pro) will be researching with the goal of making a case that the individual is the "greatest" of our founders and the other student (referred to as Con) will research to make the opposite argument; that the founder was insignificant or indeed damaging to the infant country.
- 3. Once research is completed, the students will present their arguments to the remainder of the class in the form of a debate. Each student will have no more than five minutes to present their argument followed by two minute rebuttals to refute the other's arguments. Each student will be required to make their presentations using Power Point or some other electronic presentation.
- 4. Each presentation will include a quote from a primary source and a bibliography.
- 5. The rest of the class will serve as judges using the following form. Each student will be required to take notes on the arguments of the presenters and rate each founder on a scale of one to ten, one being the least significant and ten being very significant. Each student will be required to defend their rating with a paragraph referring to the arguments presented.
- 6. The teacher will average the ratings from each of the debates and obtain the most "founding" of our founders and rank them.
